About the Play

Alice Anderson: Mechanic. Trailblazer. Entrepreneur. Founder of Australia's first all-girl garage!

It's 1920s Melbourne - society reels from the aftermath of world war I, women's fashion sets startling trends and the city hums with the music of the motorcar. Meanwhile, one small woman defies convention and makes her mark...

Sparked by historical events, Garage Girls shines a light on Alice Anderson's short but eventful life, in a world on the precipice of change.

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Meet the <u>reg</u> Alice Anderson

In 1919, Alice purchased a block of land in Kew, Melbourne and established her own motor mechanics garage, emblazoned with the name The Alice Anderson Motor Service'.

She employed all female staff and they all wore matching uniforms, including leather jackets, boots and trousers - a masculine look for the time. Her bysiness provided these women with unheard of opportunities for the time.

In 2020, Alice Anderson was inducted into the Victorian Honour Roll of Women, recognizing her significant contributions to women's employment and empowerment in the automotive industry. Her legacy continues to inspire, with exhibitions and educational programs celebrating her achievements.

Director

Anna Loren is a writer, director, actor and teaching artist, working across stage and screen. She was a finalist in the Queensland Premier's Drama Award for her play, COMFORT, and received Playwriting Australia's Erin Thomas Playwright Fund, for her play, 22. Her short monologue, BURNING SEASON was commissioned as part of the Come to Where I am anthology with Critical Stages Touring and Paines Plough. Loren is currently working on her first screenplay, SUGARCANE and is developing a new play, 10, 000 STEPS IN A DAY, seeded through Australian Plays Transform's (APT), National Playwriting Group. As a director, Loren has worked for NIDA open, Ad Astra, heartBeast Theatre, The Rose Bruford Youth Theatre, London and JMC Academy on works including When the Rain Stops Falling, Lysa and the Freeborn Dames, Normal and Nosferatu.

She has trained with a diverse range of companies, directors, voice and movement specialists including Beatrice Pemberton (Complicite), Gabriel Gawin (Song of the Goat), Struan Leslie (Movement RSC), Irina Brown (Director), Niamh Dowling (Alexander Technique), Barbara Houseman (Voice RSC), La Boite, Punch Drunk, Zen Zen Zo and the Trinity International Playwriting Festival. Anna holds an MA in Ensemble Theatre and sits on the Matilda Awards Executive Committee as Board Secretary.



Kelsey Booth is a stage manager, theatre technician and QL ab programmer based in Meanjin/Brisbane. They have experience working across a variety of productions including circus, dance, theatre and immersive performances. Kelsey was the Associate Technical Coordinator at Metro Arts in 2024. Recent projects include CAKE (Metro Arts, 2024), [gameboy] (Metro Arts, 2024), and New Beginnings (Flipside Circus, 2023). Kelsey holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Technical Production, and a Diploma of Auslan (Australian Sign Language).

In the realm of Festival Site Design, Josh is continuing his role as Site Designer for Brisbane Festival and as Site Designer for the return of QPAC's Out of the Box children's theatre festival in 2025. Josh has received a Gold Matilda Award in 2011 for his Body of Work and Silver Matilda Awards in 2015, 2017, 2018 & 2019.
