Dear parents, care givers, students, staff and visitors

RE: UPDATE – CONFIRMED COVID-19 CASES AT BRISBANE GIRLS GRAMMAR SCHOOL

This is an update to our letters dated 1st and 2nd August 2021 which you may have received yesterday.

Metro North Public Health Unit (MNPHU) was notified yesterday of a confirmed case of coronavirus (COVID-19) in a member of the school community who had extensive movements across the school campus throughout the day and evening of 30 July 2021. This case is in addition to the previously notified case of a visitor who attended the Open Day on Friday 30 July 2021. Although the latest case attended Brisbane Girls Grammar School on 30 July 2021 while infectious, they were not aware that they were infectious at the time.

This latest case has expanded the number of people considered to be close contacts (also known as primary contacts) and who are required to complete 14 days of quarantine.

To summarise the current advice for Brisbane Girls Grammar School:

All students and staff in attendance, and any visitors to the school campus (including all venues for meetings and the Open Day) on Friday 30 July 2021 from 0800 hrs until 20:30hrs are now considered close contacts.

All close contacts must quarantine at home for 14 days. People in the same household as staff, students and visitors are secondary contacts (contacts of close contacts) and must also quarantine at home for 14 days. This includes essential workers such as healthcare workers, police and border workers.

Please continue to check the contact tracing website as specific quarantine advice for your contact tracing exposure site may change. If essential workers (healthcare workers, police and border workers) are deemed by their employer to be critical to the appropriate staffing of their workplace and the worker is asymptomatic and has tested negative to COVID themselves, they may attend work if the following conditions are met:

- The close contact must be able to maintain separation from the secondary contact (the critical essential worker) as per the advice in the quarantine at home information sheet: <https://www.qld.gov.au/health/conditions/health-alerts/coronavirus-covid-19/protect-yourself-others/quarantine/home-quarantine>. This is a minimum separation. It is preferable for the worker to completely separate from the close contact, for example move to live in a house / unit at a separate address or move into a self-contained granny-flat.
- The close contact needs to be tested and a negative test needs to be returned AFTER the critical essential worker (secondary contact) is effectively separated from the close contact
- The critical essential worker (secondary contact) must inform their workplace that they have had a potential COVID exposure and the workplace should consider additional precautions if the worker is to return to work including whether rosters can be changed to minimise the secondary contact's presence at the workplace.
- The critical essential worker's workplace may require additional precautions such as:
 - That the worker (secondary contact) has been vaccinated against COVID-19

- That the worker (secondary contact) attends to saliva testing every day they are at work whilst the close contact is in quarantine;
- That the critical essential worker (secondary contact) wears a P2/N95 mask and eye protection whilst at work.

In the situation of Brisbane Girls Grammar School, the quarantine period finishes at **11:59PM on Friday, 13 Aug 2021**. Close (primary) contacts should be tested within the first days of going into quarantine. All close contacts **must** also undertake exit testing on day 12 of the quarantine period, Wednesday 11 August 2021. Additionally, any close contact or household member (secondary contact) who develops symptoms during the quarantine period should be tested immediately. It is preferable to use a drive through testing centre for this testing. Please see the following websites for the testing centre nearest to you:

As long as the primary close contact (student or staff member or school visitor) remains free from COVID-19 infection, others in the household (with the exception of critical essential workers considering returning to work) will not need to be tested, but must still quarantine until **11:59PM on Friday, 13 Aug 2021**.

COVID-19 is a highly infectious illness, which is spread from person-to-person through tiny droplets created during coughing, sneezing, singing and speaking, or via contact with contaminated objects (such as door handles or tables) and then touching your mouth or face. It can cause serious complications such as pneumonia.

Symptoms of COVID-19 include:

- Fever
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Fatigue
- Shortness of breath
- Loss of smell or loss of taste
