**RE: CONFIRMED CASE AT BRISBANE GIRLS GRAMMAR SCHOOL**

Metro North Public Health Unit (MNPHU) has been notified of exposure to a confirmed case of coronavirus (COVID-19) in a member of the school community. This person attended Brisbane Girls Grammar School while infectious, although they were not aware that they were infectious at the time. Specifically, they were at the school:

- **Friday, 30 Jul 2021 between 17:25 and 20:30**

People who were at the following venues at the relevant times are **close contacts (primary contacts)**:

- 17:35 – 17:50 'Annie Mackay' Room in the Main Building
- 17:50 – 18:00 Level 1 Band Room, Creative Learning Centre
- 18:00 – 18:45 Main entrance area – queue for food vans
- 18:45 – 19:05 Level 1 Strings Room, Creative Learning Centre
- 19:15 – 19:45 New Science Learning Building

All close contacts (also known as primary contacts) must quarantine at home for 14 days. Household members of these close (primary) contacts must also quarantine at home. These household members are considered **secondary contacts**.

All other people who were at the school during the relevant time, but not at the venues listed are casual contacts. Casual contacts must isolate, get tested as soon as practicable and continue to isolate until they receive a negative result.

If essential workers (healthcare workers, police and border workers) who are secondary contacts are deemed by their employer to be critical to the appropriate staffing of their workplace, they may attend work if the following conditions are met:

- The secondary contact (the critical essential worker) must be able to maintain separation from the close (primary) contact as per the advice in the quarantine at home information sheet: <https://www.qld.gov.au/health/conditions/health-alerts/coronavirus-covid-19/protect-yourself-others/quarantine/home-quarantine>. This is a minimum separation. It is preferable for the worker to completely separate from the close contact, for example move to live in a house / unit at a separate address or move into a self-contained granny-flat.
- The close (primary) contact needs to be tested and a negative test needs to be returned AFTER the critical essential worker (secondary contact) is effectively separated from the close contact
- The critical essential worker (secondary contact) is asymptomatic and has tested negative to COVID themselves
- The critical essential worker (secondary contact) must inform their workplace that a member of their household has had a potential COVID exposure and the workplace should consider additional precautions if the worker is to return to work.
- The critical essential worker's workplace may require additional precautions such as:

- That the worker (secondary contact) has been vaccinated against COVID-19
- That the worker (secondary contact) attends to saliva testing every day they are at work whilst the close contact is in quarantine;
- That the critical essential worker (secondary contact) wears a P2/N95 mask and eye protection whilst at work.

In this situation of exposure at Brisbane Girls Grammar, the quarantine period finishes at 11:59PM on Friday, 14 Aug 2021. Detailed information on home quarantine can be found on the Queensland Health website at:

Close (primary) contacts should be tested within the first days of going into quarantine. All close (primary) contacts **must** also undertake exit testing on **day 12** of the quarantine period, Wed 12 Aug 2021. Additionally, any contact or household member who develops symptoms during the quarantine period should be tested immediately. It is preferable to use a drive through testing centre for this testing. As long as the close (primary) contact remains free from COVID-19 infection, others in the household (secondary contacts) will not need to be tested, but must still quarantine until 11:59PM on Friday, 14 Aug 2021.

COVID-19 is a highly infectious illness, which is spread from person-to-person through tiny droplets created during coughing, sneezing, singing and speaking, or via contact with contaminated objects (such as door handles or tables) and then touching your mouth or face. It can cause serious complications such as pneumonia.

Symptoms of COVID-19 include:

- Fever
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Fatigue
- Shortness of breath
- Loss of smell or loss of taste
